Improving Chronic Disease Outcomes at Surrey Memorial Hospital

In British Columbia, over **one million** patients live south of the Fraser, many of whom are managing one or multiple chronic conditions such as cancer, heart disease, hypertension, neurological disorders, respiratory illnesses, kidney disease, diabetes, and more. These conditions are often persistent and progressive, requiring complex, long-term care.

Surrey Memorial Hospital (SMH) is the regional centre for treating a wide range of chronic diseases, providing essential support through specialized services and programs both onsite and at its affiliated health care centres.

By 2029, Surrey's population is expected to reach **785,000**, and by 2041, it is expected to exceed **one million**. Surrey is also home to one of the largest populations of South Asian residents in Canada, who are at a higher risk for conditions such as diabetes, kidney disease, and heart disease. In fact, they are four times more likely to develop heart disease compared to the general population. As the population continues to grow, so does the need for greater access to chronic disease care.

Priorities You Can Help Advance

Thanks to the generosity of our donors, **Surrey Hospitals Foundation** has made significant progress in enhancing chronic disease care across the Fraser Health region. **To continue this important work, we still need your support—your donation will help fund new equipment, expand services, and bring critical centres to life, such as:**

Renal Centre:

Opening in early 2026, this new two-storey centre will provide essential care for patients with kidney disease, operating seven days a week. The addition of 21 new dialysis stations will increase dialysis availability by more than **50**%, complementing the existing in-hospital stations and bringing the total number of stations to 60. This expansion will enable the delivery of **65,000 dialysis treatments annually.**



Cardiac Centre:

In the fall of 2025, two brand new cardiac catheterization labs and two interventional radiology suites — the first of their kind built south of the Fraser — will open to provide life-saving care for patients with heart disease. These labs will offer specialized services, including immediate diagnosis and screening, aimed at preventing heart disease and stroke. The centre will feature advanced imaging-guided technology, allowing medical staff to closely examine arteries and blood flow to and from the heart. With approximately 14 Canadian adults ages 20 and over dying from heart disease every hour, these new facilities close to home are essential to saving lives by providing high-quality care when its needed most.

Jim Pattison Outpatient Care and Surgery Centre:

This facility offers specialized services for managing chronic conditions through a wide range of outpatient care across more than 50 specialized health clinics, treating over **213,000 patients** annually. Services include diabetes education, stroke prevention, pulmonary rehabilitation, chronic pain management, bone density testing, and clinics for kidney and cardiology care, among others.
