For over one million people living south of the Fraser, that regional hospital in times of need is Surrey Memorial Hospital (SMH). While there are many cities south of the Fraser, **Surrey** is set to become **B.C.’s largest city**. Its population is expected to grow to over **785,000** residents by 2029, surpassing Vancouver’s population, and by 2041, Surrey alone is estimated to exceed **one million** residents.

With this rapid growth, even more people will turn to SMH and its associated facilities for emergency care, specialized treatment, and long-term support. To meet this rising need, health care must grow alongside the region—through life-changing programs, expansion of clinical spaces, and by equipping our care teams with advanced tools, technology, and training.

Now formally recognized as **Surrey’s official health care foundation serving patients south of the Fraser**, the Foundation carries a vital responsibility: To ensure equitable funding supports our hospitals and facilities, strengthening public health care in B.C.’s soon-to-be largest city.



The Foundation supports a wide network of major health care facilities, including:

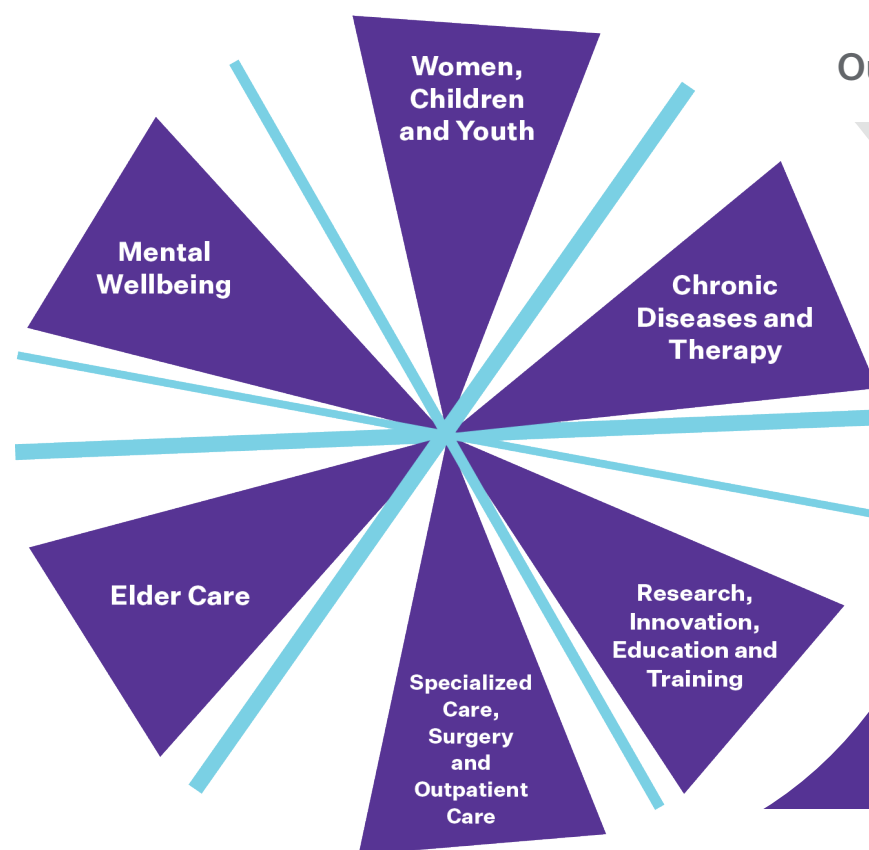
- Surrey Memorial Hospital (SMH):** As the largest of three regional hospitals in Fraser Health—Canada’s largest health authority—our site plays a critical role in delivering specialized care across the region. It operates the province’s busiest 24-hour emergency department and offers specialized care for children and youth, including a dedicated pediatric emergency room and Children’s Health Centre. SMH also provides comprehensive services in maternal health, surgery, chronic disease management, mental health, palliative care, academic training, and more.
- Jim Pattison Outpatient Care and Surgery Centre (JPOCSC):** With more than 50 specialized health clinics, the facility delivers vital outpatient services—from day surgery to diagnostics—ensuring accessible, high-quality care for the community. With 100 examination rooms and six operating rooms, it has treated over 213,000 patients annually since opening its doors in 2011.
- Long-Term Care Homes:** These facilities offer 24-hour support for adults and seniors with complex health conditions. They include the Czorny Alzheimer Centre for individuals with dementia; Laurel Place Care Centre, for acute stroke rehabilitation; and CareLife Fleetwood, the only care home in the region for ventilated patients. Each site offers a warm, welcoming environment, supported by a team of dedicated caregivers who prioritize residents’ physical, cognitive, and emotional well-being.

There’s still more work ahead to meet the needs of our growing region. With your help, we can expand access to life-changing care—for your loved ones, your neighbors, and even yourself.

Our Pillars of Care

Our Pillars of Care:

Chronic Diseases and Therapy

Many people living south of the Fraser are managing one or more chronic conditions—such as cancer, heart disease, respiratory illnesses, kidney disease, diabetes, and more. These lifelong, progressive conditions require comprehensive, ongoing care. At SMH and across its network of facilities, dedicated teams provide personalized support to help patients manage their health, prevent complications, and improve their overall well-being.

With chronic conditions on the rise and Surrey's population growing rapidly, expanding services and investing in advanced medical equipment is more important than ever.

The city is also home to British Columbia's largest South Asian community—a population at increased risk for several chronic illnesses. South Asian individuals are more likely to develop diabetes and kidney disease, and up to four times more likely to experience heart disease compared to the general population.

Your donation supports advanced treatments, innovative research, and vital programs for chronic disease care—helping speed up diagnoses and deliver safer, less invasive care.

You can also help expand critical facilities—such as Jim Pattison Outpatient Care and Surgery Centre—and support the development of new, state-of-the-art centres, including:

- A stand-alone renal centre
- The first-ever cardiac centre south of the Fraser



Women, Children and Youth

Maternal and Women’s Health Services

Surrey Memorial Hospital is the region’s leading centre for women’s acute care, providing essential support through some of life’s most vulnerable and defining moments. Whether giving birth, managing a high-risk pregnancy, or seeking preventive care, women receive specialized support—tailored to their unique health needs. Programs and services range from early screenings, labour and delivery to post-partum support and neonatal intensive care.

Among these is the Indigenous Maternal Child Health Liaison program, which works alongside maternal care teams to incorporate traditional birthing ceremonies—ensuring Indigenous families receive care that respects their traditions and values.

With over 6,000 babies welcomed each year—enough to fill a kindergarten class every 29 hours—expanding services for women is critical.

Your donation helps fund services such as maternity care, treatment for reproductive health conditions, breast health care, access to new medical equipment and essential maternal health facilities including:

- Family Birthing Unit
- Neonatal Intensive Care Unit
- Specialized maternal and women health clinics and programs



Children and Youth Services

SMH is the only facility in the region with a dedicated **Pediatric Emergency Department** for children aged 17 and under—delivering urgent, specialized care in a setting tailored to young patients. For children who require ongoing treatment and support for a wide range of complex conditions, the **Children’s Health Centre** offers an environment that meets their medical, emotional, and developmental needs, while also supporting their families. It includes outpatient clinics, a pediatric oncology unit, and pre- and post-surgical areas—all thoughtfully created for children and youth.

Donor support also enables SMH to offer holistic therapies like art, music, and physical recreation—which help children express emotions, reduce anxiety, and feel more at ease during medical procedures. These programs, along with dedicated play areas, create a calming environment that feels less like a hospital. With your help, young patients can build trust with their care teams, making treatment less intimidating and supporting stronger recoveries.

With 41% of B.C.’s children and youth living in the Fraser Health region, accessible, child-centered care has never been more urgent.

Mental Wellbeing

Over **75 per cent** of mental health conditions emerge before the age of **25**, where untreated cases often persist into adulthood. Surrey Memorial Hospital provides vital acute mental health services for children, youth, and adults—ensuring those in crisis receive the care they need when it matters most.

The hospital offers a range of therapeutic activities that give patients creative outlets to express emotions and develop strategies for navigating distress. These include art, music, pet therapy, vocational training, and multi-sensory rooms. Without early intervention, mental health challenges can become more severe—impacting education, relationships, and long-term well-being.

Additionally, recognizing how vulnerable the transition from hospital to home can be, the SMH transition team offers critical follow-up support. This includes medication management, doctor appointments, school reintegration, and access to social programs—ensuring care continues beyond hospital walls.

For adults, SMH also provides B.C.’s first-ever urgent care response centre, focusing on mental health, substance use concerns, crisis management, and stabilization.

Surrey Memorial Hospital and its associated health care facilities offer a range of programs and services to help older adults not only manage health conditions, but also continue to live fully. This includes long-term care homes designed to promote comfort and belonging. These residences feature communal kitchens, cozy living rooms, and outdoor spaces with flowers, fountains, and walking paths—elements that help residents feel truly at home.

The region is also home to the only specialized stroke rehabilitation unit south of the Fraser, offering advanced assessment, treatment, and education to help patients recover close to home.
